

# **Brason Academy Montessori school**

## **COVID-19 Enhance**ments

Based on advice taken from the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health, Brason Montessori can return to a Prepandemic environment. The Ministry of Education has amended their requirement and childcares are no longer required to have COVID-19 policies in place. In accordance with local public health the following enhancements will remain at this time.

#### Screening

- All individuals entering the childcare premises must self-screen every day before attending the program using
  the <u>screening link</u> provided on the school's website. This tool will continue to be updated to be in line with the
  province's school screening tool.
- The screening tool has been updated to align with the <u>updated COVID-19 Integrated Testing & Case, Contact and</u>
  Outbreak Management Interim Guidance: Omicron Surge
- All individuals must follow the monitoring and isolation advice outlined in the screening tool

#### **Absence Reporting**

- Brason Montessori is still required to track all absences; parents need to advise us why their child will be absent and if they're experiencing any health-related symptoms.
- If absenteeism rises 30% above baseline for COVID related absences, Brason Montessori will contact local Public Health and a letter will be provided to families signed by the local Medical Officer of Health with public health measures to follow.

#### **Rapid Antigen Tests**

- Brason Montessori may continue to receive bi-weekly shipments of Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) from the Ministry
  of Education as part of our screening program.
- Tests are available to both staff and children who are symptomatic, Brason Montessori and will continue to distribute test kits to staff, and families as needed.

### **Environmental Cleaning**

- Existing cleaning and sanitizing practices will be reviewed to determine where enhancements are required, including frequency and timing of cleaning and disinfection, areas to clean and/or disinfect, choice of cleaning products, child safety, staffing, signage, and PPE to use when cleaning.
- Brason Montessori will be cleaned frequently; staff will follow daily/weekly and monthly cleaning checklists.
- Staff will clean and disinfect high touch surfaces a minimum of twice per day (more often if visibly soiled).
   Examples include doorknobs, gate latches, toilet handles, faucets, handrails, counters, electronic devices, and tabletops.

## **Hand Hygiene and Respiratory Etiquette**

- Focus will be on regular hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette to help reduce the risk of infection.
- All staff are trained on how to support children with appropriate hand hygiene, including the use of hand sanitizer, and reinforcing its use.
- Hand hygiene should be conducted by anyone entering Brason Montessori and incorporated into the daily schedule at regular intervals during the day, above and beyond what is usually recommended. Age-appropriate signs are posted around the school to support this practice.
- Alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing a minimum of 60% alcohol can be used, only if the hands are not visibly soiled.
- Hand washing using soap and water is recommended over alcohol-based hand rub for children. Hand sanitizer will be used when a sink is not accessible.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at the entry point of each classroom and main entry into the childcare
- Hand sanitizer should be stored where children cannot access.
- Modifications will be put into place to support any children with special needs to regularly perform hand hygiene as independently as possible.

## Masking

- In alignment with community masking requirements, masks will no longer be required for staff, or any other individual at Brason Montessori as of Monday April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Staff/children may choose to continue to wear masks/eye protection. The government plans to continue to provide free masks and eye protection to the childcare.
- Brason Montessori will be a respectful, welcoming community to all individuals and their personal decision regarding masking
- Masking is still required:
  - 14 days following international travel (inside and outside), along with tracing close contacts during those
     14 days
  - o If an individual has been in close contact with a positive case, or if someone in your household has tested positive or has symptoms.
  - 10 days following an individual who has tested positive or symptom onset (20 days for immunocompromised).

#### Ventilation

- Brason Montessori will implement best practices to optimize ventilation by moving activities outdoors as much as possible.
- Hepa filters have been added to the classrooms and will be turned on at arrival and run during program times.

#### **Vaccinations**

- Vaccinations remain the best defense against COVID-19, including the Omicron variant.
- Brason Montessori supports vaccinations, and will assist staff and families in booking vaccine appointments also and peer to peer support.

## Monitoring and Responding to COVID symptoms while at attending the Program

- Educators will conduct a daily health check on all children in attendance.
- If someone becomes ill while at the childcare, the individual will be separated from others (in the isolation room if possible).
- Parents/guardians will be contacted for pick up and should be instructed to pick up within 30-60 minutes.
- Anyone providing care to the ill individual should wear appropriate PPE (surgical mask and eye protection) and should maintain as much physical distance as possible.
- If tolerated the ill child should also wear a medical mask (not for children under 2).
- These PPE items are available in the staff room.
- Hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette should be practiced while the ill individual is waiting to be picked up.
- Contaminated articles belonging to the symptomatic child (including soiled clothing) are to be sent home immediately for cleaning.
- The illness will be noted in both the classroom log.
- All ill individuals will then follow the Ontario school screening for next steps and isolation requirements.

## Once the child has been picked up the following cleaning will be conducted:

- Clean all areas the separated individual was in (i.e. isolation room) and other areas in the childcare setting the
  individual was within 2 meters of, or equipment/toys the child was using should be conducted as soon as
  reasonably possible.
- All linens touched/used by the symptomatic child at the centre must be placed in the laundry immediately.
- Staff should wear additional PPE (gloves, gown, and eye protection) while cleaning areas the ill individual or handling any linens.
- All PPE should be disposed of after cleaning.

Please note: Any changes or updates will continue to be communicated promptly to all staff and families of Brason Academy Montessori School.
